Locomotives, Carriages, Service Vehicles and Wagons

By Grant Goss (Fred), published by Don River Railway. The book is a quick reference to what the Don River Railway has preserved and restored. While the bulk of the items covered in this publication are of the Tasmanian Government Railways, there are items from the Emu Bay Railway and other private or construction operators. The book is generally laid out with a page for each object, with specifications, an outline diagram and a photograph.

By Peter Evans — **Published by the LRRSA**. The Yarra Track crossed the Great Dividing Range in Victoria, from Healesville to the gold mining town of Woods Point. The first wheeled vehicle to reach Woods Point via the Track arrived on 1 November 1864. This book describes the small townships which developed along the track, and the development of the timber industry in the area The book is based on 35 years of patient trawling through archives and newspapers, supported by interviews with many of the sawmill residents, and intensive field research at sawmills, mine and tramway sites. It describes what went on in these forests and the difficulties faced by those who lived and worked there.
